Michaelmas 1	Animal Farm by George Orwell
ALL A MIMALS ARE EQUAL BUT SOME ANTINE SOME ANTINE SOME ANTINE SOME ANTINE	A study of the allegorical novel exploring the corrupting force of power and greed in society. Pupils will learn analysis skills to focus on the writer's key messages as well as developing their own creative writing skills using the text as inspiration.
Michaelmas 2	Shakespearean Rhetoric
	Building on the theme of power, pupils will study a wide range of speeches from different Shakespeare plays. With a focus on the Power of Rhetoric, pupils will learn the power of persuasion both in their writing and their speech. This unit will include a Spoken Language opportunity where pupils will deliver a persuasive speech to their peers using the methods they have learned.
Lent 1	Poems from other cultures
	Pupils study a range of poems from diverse backgrounds and cultures. These poems cover the themes of identity in a complex and developing world. Pupils will also en- gage in non-fiction wider reading around certain topics to help support their under- standing of some of the issues raised in the poems. For example, 'Not My Business' a Nigerian poem about oppression and fear and 'Limbo' which covers the theme of the Trans-Atlantic Slave Trade.
Lent 2	Non Fiction Speech Writing
	Pupils will have the opportunity to read a wide range of influential speeches before using the methods taught to write and deliver their own on a topic that means some- thing to them. This until covers non-fiction writing skills but also allows pupils to devel op their spoken language skills and grow in confidence to deliver on front of a group.
Trinity 1	Short Story Unit
ACHERATIC REVENUES OF THE DESCRIPTION OF THE DESCRI	Pupils will have the opportunity to read a variety of engaging short stories before applying the techniques learned to write their own. This unit covers key fiction writing skills, focusing on language, tone, and structure, while encouraging pupils to develop their creativity. Pupils will read classic short fiction such as Examination Day by Henry Slesar and The Tell-Tale Heart by Edgar Allen Poe. Pupils will complete an English Language creative writing assessment, where they will produce their own original piece of creative writing, applying the techniques and skills developed throughout the unit.
Trinity 2	Antigone- A Greek Play
	Pupils will have the opportunity to engage with the classic Greek tragedy Antigone,
